“Designed to replace standard outdoor trash receptacles, a solar trash compactor like the BigBelly® automatically compacts up to 200 gallons of trash into one neat bag for easy disposal. Cordless, self-charging, and portable, the BigBelly® cuts collection trips by 75-90%, preventing unsightly and costly bin overflow, reducing vehicle emissions, and enhancing public enjoyment of cities, parks and beaches. Made in Massachusetts by Seahorse Power, it costs approximately \$4,000.”

Other purchases using grant money are possible as well.

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## Appendix C – Massachusetts General Law: Section 25A

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In Massachusetts general Law, **chapter 25A, section 11C** describes the Request For Proposal (**RFP**) process for seeking ESPCs. This requires fairly complete and detailed proposals, which must be compared considering a number of factors including cost. Contract terms are limited to 10 years.

MGL **chapter 25A section 11I** describes the newer Request for Qualifications (**RFQ**) process. It allows governments to seek contracts based on the ability of the vendor to provide the service. This law will apply if the “Issue an energy savings performance contract RFQ” recommendation is pursued.
